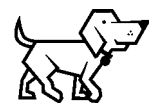
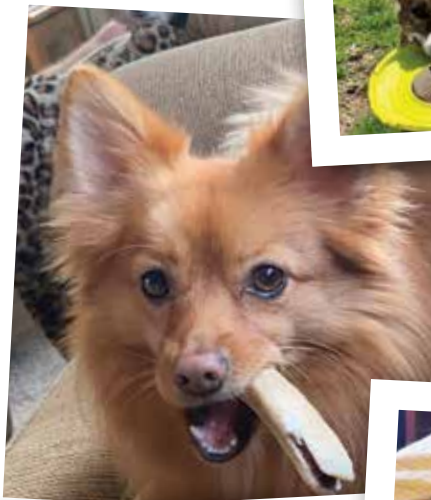

THE DEBATE: Do Dogs Really Smile?

How many times have you seen a dog with a wide-open face smile of joy? Or a cheesy toothy grin? Are these smiles? "This "dog smile" usually occurs in situations when they are relaxed and appear happy, which is why dog owners think it is a smile. These "dog smiles" also often occur in response to a human smile, which is a phenomenon called laughter contagion. Dogs may appear to smile because we smile at them." *Purina UK*

When we humans greet people, are happy or content we smile. There is a debate whether or not dogs have learned this behavior from their humans. Most of the time when dogs smile, they are indeed happy, so it's easy to relate that expression to human smiles.

"Most scientists think the canine smile stems from a combination of evolution and the fact that dogs are masters of analyzing

human behavior. They know exactly how to make us happy. Since most humans react when they see a dog smile—either by smiling back, making approving noises, or providing treats—the dog is rewarded for this behavior and does it more often."

"Sometimes, we smile at other people as a social ritual just to express friendliness. Domesticated dogs will do something similar, but they go beyond facial expressions. Dogs use their entire body posture to communicate a message to other dogs, such as, "I'm friendly and just

want to play," or, "This is my owner; please keep your distance," or, "Take one step closer and I'll let you have it!"

Just as we can tell when people are giving us a "fake" smile, dogs can tell what messages are being conveyed by reading the body language of another dog." *PetMD*

If your dog is not a smiler, how can you tell if they are happy? Look at your pup's body language. Most dogs are not subtle when they are happy. They will read off your happiness as well!

By the way, it is thought that "Dogs are also capable of laughing, and they typically laugh when they are playing. Canine laughter begins with the doggy equivalent of smiling but also includes a sound that is much like panting." 🐾

Lost Dog Prevention & Lost Dog Protocol

Has your beloved pet gone missing? Here are preventative care tips and helpful hints.

Be sure that your dog has properly fastened ID tags on their collar - name and phone number, not just rabies tag or city license tag.

Be sure your dog has either a collar with their name and your number stitched/embroidered into it or write your number on the collar with a black Sharpie marker in case the ID tags fall off.

Be sure your dog is microchipped and registered - be sure to update your pet's chip registry if any of your contact information changes.

Be sure to always have your dog on a flat leash (generally, 4-6ft leash is best). Hands-free leashes are optimal, especially if you're

out hiking/jogging/camping, etc! They are a fantastic choice because not only are your hands free, your dog is attached to you.

Please DO NOT use a retractable leash. Retractable leashes (a.k.a. extendable or flexi leashes) usually have long, thin cords (or "tape"/"belt" versions) housed into a plastic compartment with a handle. The whole device is spring-loaded (which can snap or be pulled out) and a button, which acts as a brake, controls how much of the leash is extended. Flexi-leashes typically range from around 10 feet to 26 feet in length, which gives your dog too much uncontrolled space between you. Dogs can easily run out into traffic, have

unintentional or invited contact with people or dogs, or get tangled up with another person or dog. The handle of most flexi-leashes can easily be ripped out of your hand by a strong or enthusiastic dog. The hard plastic handles are both bulky and slippery to hold onto (especially for Minnesotans wearing bulky gloves or mittens). If your dog bolts, they will end up dragging this noisy, plastic thing bouncing behind them. Most dogs will run farther/faster to escape the scary thing following them. Retractable leash cords/ribbons have also been known to cause serious bodily harm, including severed fingers, cuts, rope-burns and damage to dogs' legs/bodies.

Be sure your dog has either a properly fitted martingale collar so they can't slip out of it and/or double up with a collar AND a properly fitted harness (we love the harness lead <https://www.harnesslead.com>).

Transition Tips and Post Retrieval Safety Tips: We recommend the Two-Week shutdown for ALL dogs that have been safely retrieved after being lost and ALL newly adopted dogs (regardless of where you adopted them from). When is it **too Hot** and When is it **too Cold**

Living in the Northland we certainly live with extreme temperatures and extreme weather. "The Weather in Duluth Switches like a Cat's Mood." Minnesota Nice Dog Company

The size, breed and physical attribute contribute to how well a dog can tolerate heat or cold. Smaller dogs have less tolerance for heat or cold extremes compared to larger breeds. Breeds with short snouts such as a Bulldog, Pug... have a harder time panting and expelling heat. According to the Humane Society of the United States, "When animals pant and moisture evaporates, this takes away heat from their bodies. If the humidity is too high, they're unable to cool themselves and their temperature will skyrocket to dangerous levels very quickly."

"Other physical attributes might make it more challenging for pups to tolerate

the heat. If they have heavier hair or wiry fur coats, they could benefit from shorter trims when temperatures rise. However, never shave double-coated breeds <https://www.dailypaws.com/dogs-puppies/dog-grooming/shaved-dog>, as their fur provides both cooling and sun protection <https://www.dailypaws.com/gear-apparel/dog-supplies/dog-grooming-supplies/dog-sunscreen>."

"So how hot is too hot and how cold is too cold for dogs to be outside? Depending on their breed, size, and activity level, probably anything within the higher range of that temperature window and above, as outlined on the chart above."

Things to consider: On those rare hot northern days, take an adventure to Lake Superior, go for a dip versus a walk. Find a shady trail and avoid the pavement.

There are so many trails in this area! Go explore! Use booties for both winter to protect against salt and cold and summer to protect against the heat of the sidewalk. Take your outing early or later day on hot days. Keep the outings shorter and close to home on frigid days. Always, consider the age, breed, size and health of your dog when walking in extreme temperatures. 🐾

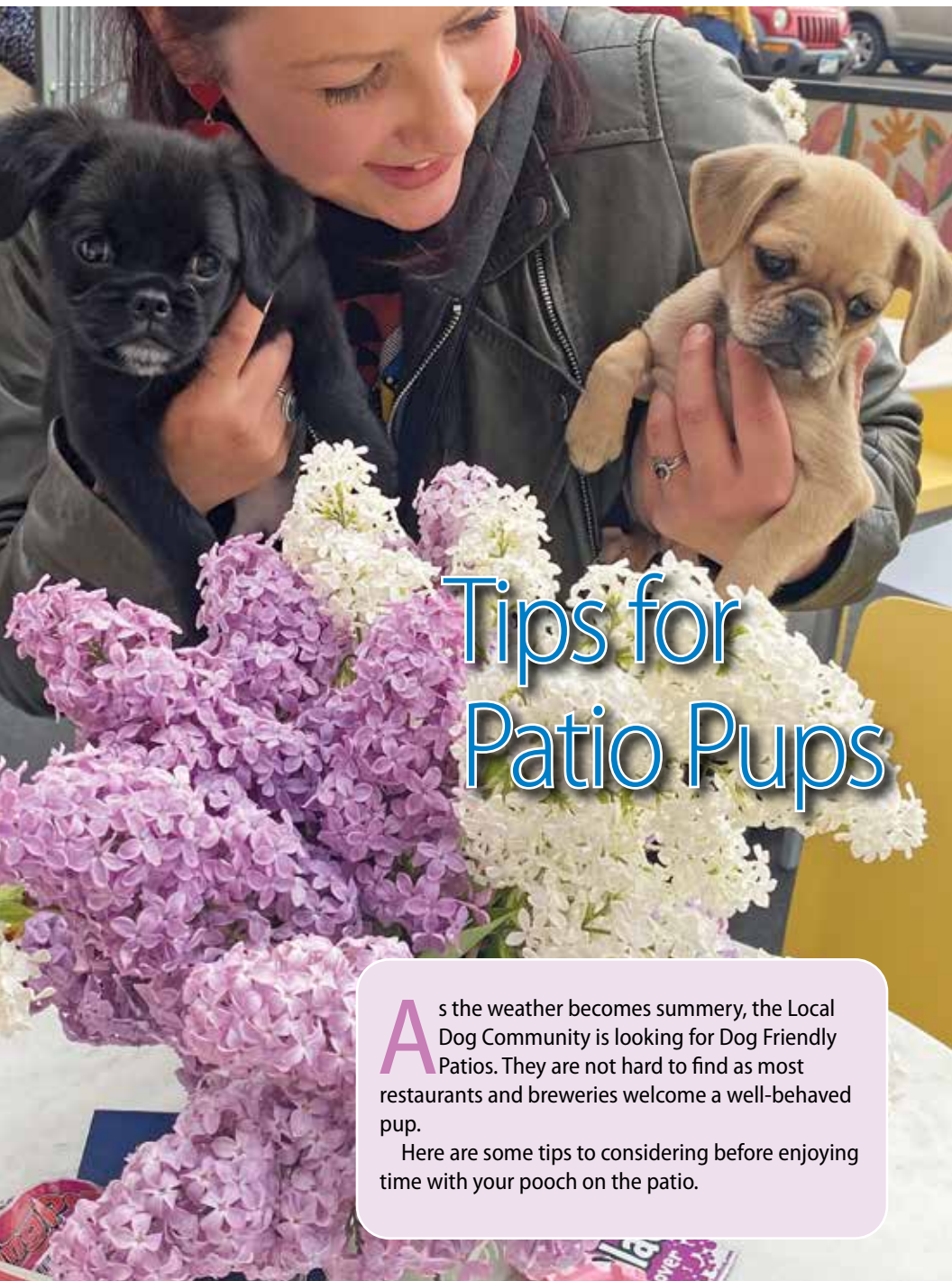

As the weather becomes summery, the Local Dog Community is looking for Dog Friendly Patios. They are not hard to find as most restaurants and breweries welcome a well-behaved pup.

Here are some tips to considering before enjoying time with your pooch on the patio.

- **Feed your Dog Before you Go!** This might cut down on some side table begging, but once they get a whiff of your yummy dinner there is no guarantee.
- **Take a Leash!** Every restaurant we spoke with requires a dog to be well behaved and leashed to be allowed to chill on the patio
- **Exercise your Pup Before Hand!** Walking or running your furry friends prior to your time out with them. With so many people and action stimulating your pup, this might cut down on barking, whining, pacing and energetic behavior. Plus, it will burn some of your calories so you can partake in more relaxation time!
- **Think of your Dog's Comfort!** Grab a table in the shade if hot, bring a blanket to avoid lying on a hot deck. The more comfortable they are, the more comfortable you will be.
- **Bring a Water Bowl or Dog Treats!** Keep your dog hydrated with water and have treats to positively reward good behavior.
- **Always Check the Establishment's Policy!** Some breweries allow dogs only on the patio and not inside. There are outdoor concert events that allow dogs while others do not. It's a good idea to confirm prior to heading out.
- **Enjoy your Time with your Pup!** Relax! Your pup will read your energy. It is good to introduce your pup to new situations, smells, sights and sounds.
- **Check in with your Dog Frequently!** If your dog is content, snoozing under the table, maybe hang out a little longer. If your pup is showing anxiety, shaking, pacing, barking it might be time to head home. Listen to your dog. 🐾

Focus Skills to Teach

Focus is my favorite skill to teach dogs. It trains the understanding that in a world full of competing distractions, paying attention to their human is a dog's best option. Focus is the foundation for all kinds of good things, such as enjoying walks with your dog.

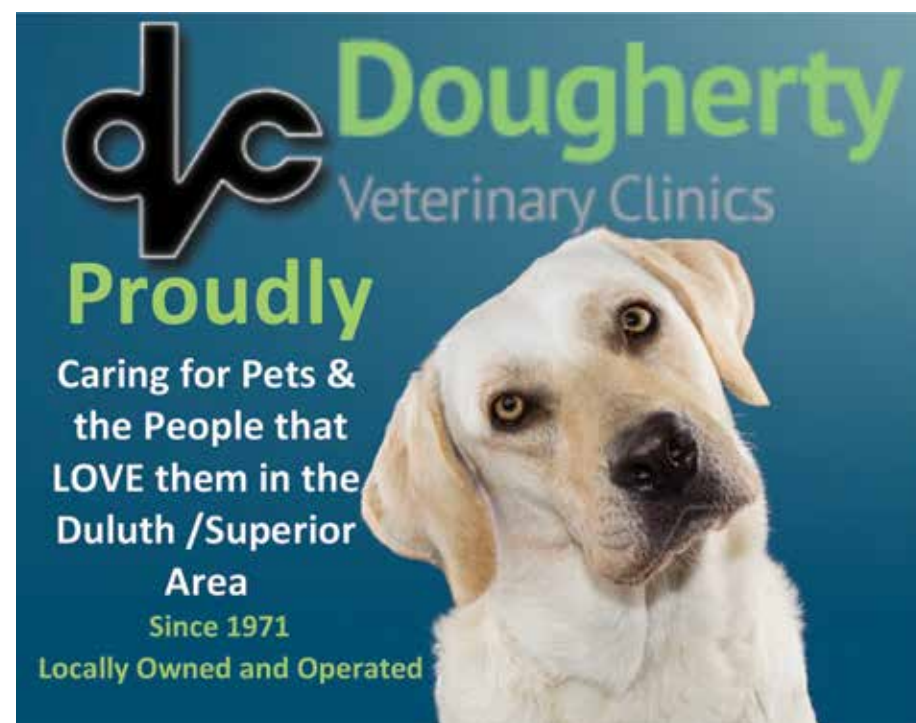
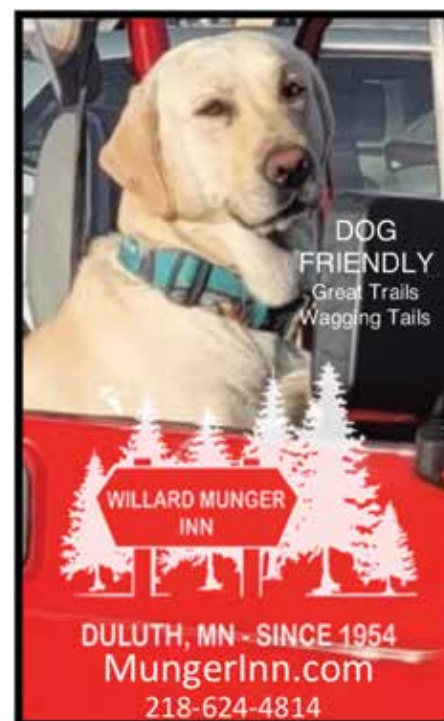
Several different exercises build focus, including "name game" and "touch/target." My favorite is "eye contact." The goal for this exercise is that your dog gives you their attention despite distractions without needing a cue or lure. Here is how it works. Begin working in a low distraction indoor space. Hold a treat in your hand and wave it in front of your dog's nose. Then hold your hand slightly away from your body. Your dog's eyes should follow the food in hand. If not, then briefly wave it in front of

their nose again. Wait quietly for your dog to look into your eyes.

Resist the urge to lure your dog's eyes with words or sounds. Those are different exercises with different goals. Just wait quietly and enjoy watching your dog work to solve this puzzle. Your dog will try a few things first. They might attempt snatching the treat from your hand. Or jump, bark,

and paw at you. Or sit, down, sit, down, sit. They will try all the things that have gotten them rewards in the past - note a lesson in that. Correct wrong guesses by saying "No." When your dog eventually does meet your eyes with theirs, move quickly. Say "Yes!" and deliver the food reward to their mouth.

Once your dog succeeds consistently, start building skill challenge. For example, use your other hand. You will be surprised how much challenge this slight change offers. Use different rewards, like affection or play. Work around distractions, like other pets. Work outside in your yard and on walks where squirrels and passing dogs offer endless opportunities to hone your dog's focus skills. With lots of practice, you and your dog could be on your way to enjoying beautiful loose leash walks this summer. 🐾

Make your first visit without your dog to familiarize yourself with the site (parking, access gates, etc). Make your initial doggie visit at a time that is not as busy. Daytime hours during the week and late afternoons on the weekend are generally quiet times at the dog park.

Remember that many dogs who visit the dog park are NOT socialized to children. Keep children close and DO NOT ALLOW running, screaming, or food. Do not allow your children to approach a dog without permission from the dog's handler.

Know your dog! Not all dogs are good candidates for off-leash parks. If your dog has not had regular interaction with other dogs, it may lack the necessary social skills to make your visit safe and enjoyable. Check for training schools that offer remedial socialization classes for adult dogs or for trainers who will work with



you at the off-leash parks. Socialize young puppies (8-16 weeks of age) at a puppy kindergarten class, not at the dog park.

Let your dog off-leash as soon as you arrive within the boundaries of the park. Mixing leashed and unleashed dogs commonly causes problems. Leashed dogs often feel threatened by the free dogs and will display provocative body language and defensive behavior. If you are uncomfortable about letting your dog off-leash, DO NOT visit the off-leash park.

Keep walking! Walking, rather than sitting or standing will help minimize defensive and territorial behaviors. This means that your dog is more likely to pass another dog with a friendly sniff instead of a stare down.

Be aware that dogs have different play styles, temperaments, and physical abilities. Many dogs love rambunctious play, but

some dogs suffer from injuries and some are more timid and aloof. Always respect the wishes of the handler and be prepared to move to another area of the park if your dog is too rambunctious. Leash up and leave if your dog is acting in an aggressive manner.

Pick up poop - always, everywhere! Hundreds of dogs visit the off-leash dog parks every month, and they need to be kept clean. Nobody likes to look at or step in dog poop - please use the mutt mitts!

Keep the area safe and clean. Remove extra water jugs. Pick up trash, cigarette butts, and orphan poops. Do not allow your dog to dig holes which can cause injuries to unsuspecting people and dogs. Leave the site in better condition than you found it. Small actions, multiplied by hundreds of visitors, are what keep our off-leash dog areas a success. 🐾

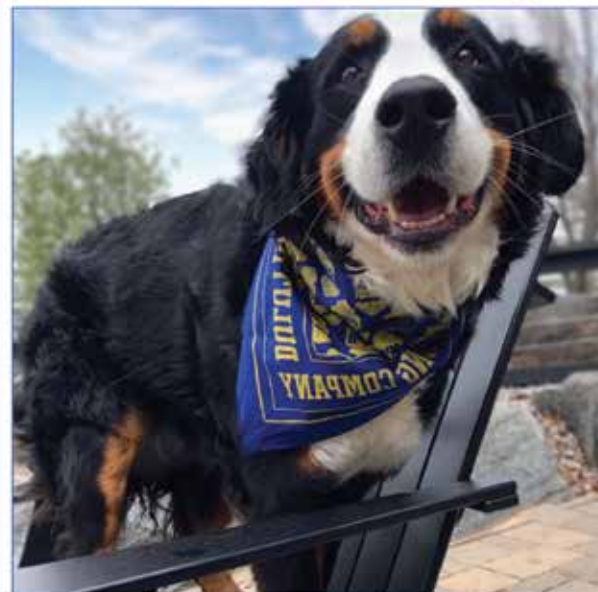
